Report Card and Parent/Guardian/Teacher Interviews

Elementary Report cards will sent home with students in FDK to Grade 6 on Tuesday February 13th.

In Grades 1-6, this report card will record students' grades in all subject areas and show how they are working towards the achievement of curriculum expectations and their development of learning skills and work habits from September to this point in the school year. The new TDSB Kindergarten Report will be sent home with Kindergarten students and will present progress in four areas: Belonging and Contributing, Demonstrating Literacy and Mathematics Behaviours, Problem Solving and Innovating, and Self-Regulation and Well-Being. Parent/teacher interviews will take place on Thursday, February 15th in the evening, on Friday, February 16th in the morning, or at other mutually convenient times. Interviews are not mandatory for all students during this round.

Teachers or Parents/Guardians may request interviews at this time, if either feel it is necessary.

February is African Heritage Month at the TDSB


This is an opportunity to recognize the experiences, contributions and achievements of African Canadians. This year's theme is "From Africa to the World."

Registrations can be taken at any point until the first day of school in September (and beyond for anyone living in our school district). 
Many team groups have already been formed, showing that we have some very keen readers at Whitney! In the Battle of the Books, teams compete against each other in a 'game show' format answering factual questions about the books. Each team has a bell and the first team to ring in and say a correct answer gets a point. The team with the most points in every round



Our wonderful parent volunteers read all ten the books and compile lists of questions for each book. i.e. Q: What is the name of the ship that Jonah wakes up on in "The Incredible Space Raiders from Space!"? (A:The Fantastic Flying Squirrel).



The 'battles' generally take place in the mornings before school at 8:00 a.m. in the library, computer room and French room, and will run for approximately two weeks ending with a final 'BATTLE' assembly between the top two teams.



Parents, please encourage your Grade 4/5/6 kids to participate in this year's Battle of the Books! The battles are lots of fun and the benefits are many • the momentum created by reading (up to) ten books encourages further reading • it encourages 'book talk' amongst friends - imagine! • it encourages deeper reading and understanding of books ● it gives students the opportunity to have fun with friends around books!


WHITNEY JR. CHOIR TDSB CHORAL FESTIVAL
