STEP days incorporate Spirit Days, Pizza lunches, and assemblies taking place on these days. There will be opportunities to have students recognized and to celebrate what has been going on in their classrooms. The main change in these days is the content and opportunity to have either a Character Education focus (TDSB Character Traits), an Equity focus, or both. We are also looking to focus on goal setting and self-improvement. This gives us 10 opportunities in the year to reflect on how we are doing and think of a way to improve or do better. It might be related to academics, work habits, social interactions, kindness...the possibilities are many. Students and Staff can focus on something meaningful to them.

In the month of September, our focus was on RESPECT. Over the past month, staff discussed this theme in the classroom, and students shared quotes over the announcements that were reflective. We have been looking out for student actions and language that demonstrated respect both inside and outside the classroom.

Our first STEP day takes place **Thursday September 27th** at 10:30 am. The Spirit Day will be **Orange Shirt Day**. It is our first Pizza Lunch day as well. Parents/Guardians are always welcome to join in on the fun and attend our assembly.

Orange Shirt (Day: September 30, 2018)

(Declared annually across Canada)

Near the end of September, students and staff across the TDSB will come together and wear Orange Shirts to recognize the harm that the Residential School System did to First Nations, Métis and Inuit children and to recognize that "Every Child Matters." Here at Whitney, we will wear Orange shirts on **Thursday September 27th** to coincide with our STEP day and Pizza lunch.

Orange shirt day is a movement that officially began in 2013 but in reality it began in 1973 when six year old Phyllis Webstad entered the St. Joseph Mission Residential School, outside of Williams Lake, BC. The date, September 30, was chosen because that was the time of the year the trucks and buses would enter the communities to "collect" the children and deliver them to their harsh new reality of cultural assimilation, mental, sexual and physical abuse, shame and deprivation. The impact of residential schools affects every Canadian.

Yonge Eglinton Development Redirection


Eglinton P.S., located on the South West corner of Eglinton and Mt. Pleasant has been facing challenges with enrolment and space at their school for many years now. Their grade six students were moved to Hodgson Middle School in recent years and their boundaries have been reduced so that other schools like Maurice Cody would be able to take on more of their students. With the large number of developments in the area north of Eglinton, their school cannot continue to receive all of those students. The 1.6 acre site cannot accommodate portables or a vertical The TDSB is planning to build another elementary school in that area in 3-5 years but in the meantime other measures need to be put in place.

On June 20th, 2018, a motion was passed at a TDSB Board meeting to have students from some of the condo developments bussed to Whitney P.S. for the next few years. It is proposed that approximately 20 students from that area (the majority being Kindergarten students) attend Whitney each year. This would begin next September for the 2019-2020 school year.

Currently our school is at 71% capacity with five classrooms not being used. While there are many benefits and some challenges, additional students would allow our school to receive additional staffing and specialist teachers for the full day.
