



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#### progress report card (grades 1-6)

Next month your child will receive his/her Elementary Progress Report Card. The purpose of a progress report is to encourage early and ongoing

communication between you and your child's teacher. As you may be aware, a large focus on all report cards is on the learning skills and work habits. At Whitney, we feel that the development of these learning skills is an integral part of a student's learning. We feel it is important that all children clearly understand teacher expectations with regards to their learning and work habits on a day to day basis in all subject areas for self-improvement.

In an effort to support students learning in advance of the reporting period, the teachers at Whitney have created the attached charts (primary- grades 1-3) and junior (grades 4-6) into child friendly language.
