Safe Arrival Program – New Automated System Coming Soon!

One measure of keeping your children safe is to ensure we can

account for any absences or reasons for them being late to school. We would like to remind you that if your child is going to be absent or late for any reason, we ask that you contact the office immediately and report the reason for the absence.

If we are not informed about the absence, we will make attempts to contact you to determine the reason for the absence through our Safe Arrival Program. In the near future, we will be moving to an automated call-out system for our Safe Arrival Program.

Today, you child will be bringing home a student verification letter, which is the first step in this transition. Please take a moment and read it carefully. Working Together for a Safer Community



One of the best parts of living in the Whitney community is the variety of activities we can enjoy in our parks and public spaces all year round. The beginning of the school year presents a good opportunity to remind everyone to take extra care in enjoying all the outdoors can offer.

As you know, we are fortunate to have a number of safety measures, programs, and policies that contribute to a safe and caring school. However, most incidents happen away from school and outside school hours. All parents, students and staff are reminded of the need to be aware and alert at all times, even in the most ordinary and everyday routines. Our staff regularly speak to students about how to stay safe. I know that you too will want to help ensure our community is as safe as possible. See to the right for some tips that you may find helpful when discussing safety with your child.

Our staff also periodically review street and traffic safety with our students. We ask that you reinforce these safety messages with your children as well. Below is a list of tips that might be helpful to review:

- stop, look, and listen for traffic
- only cross at corners and crosswalks
- never run into the street
- obey crossing signals
- walk on sidewalks

- where there are no sidewalks, walk as far away from traffic as possible facing traffic.

For those who drive, please take extra care on the roads, especially in areas where children might be present.

Working together, we can make our communities safer for our children.

- Always walk with a buddy to and from school
 - Always tell your parents where you are

• Never accept gifts from strangers and never approach or enter a stranger's car; adults have no acceptable reason to offer a ride or to ask children for directions or assistance

• If a car is following you, change directions and run

• When help is needed, go to the nearest store or school, the home of a friend or run towards a group of people or a parent with children

- Know your name, address and phone number
- Know that police officers are friends and can help you
- Tell your parents or teacher whenever someone treats you in a way that makes you feel uncomfortable or unsafe; TRUST YOUR INSTINCTS.



French Programs Application Deadline

For families interested in the Toronto District School

Board's French Immersion or Extended French programs, we offer an online process for applying to:

- Early French Immersion (EFI) which begins in Senior Kindergarten;
- Junior Extended French (JEF) which begins in Grade 4
- Middle Immersion which begins in Grade 4 (available in a limited number of schools)

We guarantee an offer of placement in the program (not a specific school) to all on-time applicants. Transportation is provided as per the Board's Transportation policy. This year, there is an important change to the timelines for applying for these programs for September 2015.

Applications for Early French Immersion (for a Junior Kindergarten aged child), must be completed online between Nov. 3rd and Dec. 5th 2014. Applications for Junior Extended French or Middle French Immersion (for a child currently in Grade 3), must be completed online between Jan. 5th and Jan. 29th 2015.

Offers of placement within your chosen program will be made to all on-time applicants in the weeks following the close of the application window. Please note: families with an older sibling currently in a French program are still required to complete an online application for the new student.
