



Student Entrance @ 8:42am

This is a reminder to all parents and students that the school bell rings every morning at 8:42AM. Beginning at8:30AM, we have 2 teachers on yard duty supervising any students who come to school early. We ask that all students in grades 1-6 and parents remain outside until the bell rings. At that time, all students will line up as they always do in front of their respective doors. Once students are lined up, the teachers on duty will open the doors.

During inclement weather, students are welcome to stand inside the main entrance doors until the bell rings. Unless a student has a meeting with a teacher prior to 8:42AM, we do ask that all students and parents remain outside until the bell rings as we do not have supervision inside the building before that time.

SCOOTERS, SKATEBOARDS, LONG BOARDS and BIKES This is a

very important reminder for all students who bring their scooters, skateboards, long boards and bikes to school. Scooters, skateboards, long boards and bikes may be used to get to school, but are NOT to be used on school property. Students must walk their bikes onto school property and lock them up by the bike racks. Also, scooters, skateboards and long boards must be left outside under the overhang outside the main doors and not used between the hours of 8:30 and 3:45. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

safe arrivals

Please help us ensure that all children arrive safely at school by using the Safe Arrival reporting procedure **every time** your child is absent or late before 8:45am each school day.

There are two ways to report for Safe Arrival:

- 1. Call our Hotline number @ 416-393-9384
- 2. Email whitney@tdsb.on.ca

For either option, please make sure you provide the following information:

- child's name
- child's room number (or teacher name)
- reason for absence or lateness

NOTE Please do not call the main school number with Safe Arrival messages.

safe arrivals... what happens if you forget?

The TDSB has implemented a board wide elementary school Automated Call-out system for safe arrival. If you do not let the school office know about your child's absence or lateness, the system will call you for each reporting period (morning AND afternoon attendance).

Here's how it works:

- 1. System will call the student's listed "Home" number
- If someone picks up and follows all the prompts, no other calls will be made
 - If no one picks up, or all prompts are not followed, the system "cascades"
- 2. Cascade = system calls all numbers for both parents 3 times
- 3. System generates a report and notifies the school which students had successful call-outs and which students need follow up.
- **NOTE** Once the system starts the call-out process, it cannot be stopped by the school.

ealth & satety reminders

anaphylaxis



There are students in our school who have a potentially life-threatening allergy (anaphylaxis) to foods, predominantly peanuts and nuts. Please do not send peanut butter or products with

peanuts or ANY nuts to school in your child's lunch or snack. If your child has peanut butter or any peanut product at home, they should wash their hands and brush their teeth before coming to school.

The medical form sent home with all students asks about health concerns, but if your child is anaphylactic and you have not informed the school, please do so immediately. Please continue to keep the school updated as medical information and/or needs change and provide the school with two epi pens — one will be kept in the office and it is recommended that we have an epi-pen in the classroom if a student is not carrying the pen with them at all times. Epi pens kept in the school need to be replaced by parents when they reach the expiry date.

epi pens

If your child requires an epi pen please make sure the office and classroom teacher is informed and aware of your child's needs and you have filled out the required paperwork. Students should carry their epi pen with them at all times and provide an extra one to be stored in the office. Please provide one to the office immediately (with your child's name on it).

medication

School staff cannot administer medication (Tylenol, cough syrup, antibiotics, etc.) unless the proper TDSB forms have been filled out by parents and signed some cases, by a medical doctor, giving permission and listing specific instructions for administering. These forms can



be obtained from the office and upon completion will be kept on file in the office with all medication. Please call the office if you have any questions.

curriculum night

All parents and their children are invited to come and meet your child's teacher in an "open house" forum on Thursday September 22nd beginning at 6:30 pm. We will begin the evening in the gym with a welcome assembly and then teachers and students are invited back to the classroom to see the room and meet the teacher. Children will take their parents on a tour of the classroom...so be prepared to be dazzled! There will not be a formal presentation by the teacher, but all teachers will be available to answer any curriculum questions you may have in the classroom. As well, teachers will have handy dandy handouts to provide you with more information about the curriculum content for the school year. We are so excited to share with you our version of the "Week of Inspirational Math" (WIM). This school-wide initiative from Kindergarten to Grade 6 students involved in 5 math open inquiry lessons! Implementing these Inspirational Math days stems from staff building upon teaching practices that develop a Growth Mindset when students approach new learning.

Part of our professional learning has been to further our understanding around what it means to have a Growth Mindset and how it can improve upon student success!

Generally, a Growth Mindset is the concept of understanding that the brain has an incredible ability to grow and change regardless of age – also called brain plasticity!

So, as a school, we have decided to embark on using the math lessons developed by Stanford's University, called Week of Inspirational Math (WIM). These 5 openended inquiry lessons are what we might call "low-floor/high-ceiling" activities where ALL students have multiple entry points to participate regardless of math level or initial concept understanding. The accompanying videos introduce the overview of learning.

Parents are encouraged to talk with your children with regards to the math they will be learning next week. As well, when you come to our Curriculum Night on September 22nd, you will have the opportunity to see the results of this exciting week!

Drop everything and "Mind Up!"



DPA: Daily Physical Activity


