Who are we?

12 parent volunteers representing all grade levels at the school (Kindergarten to Grade 6).

What do we do?

We meet monthly and hold general meetings open to all parents four times a year. The general meeting dates will be published in Whitney's newsletter, the "Whitney Word".

We are responsible for the annual Council budget. The Council's goal is to enhance the educational experience of Whitney students through balanced investment across key learning categories. There are two key sources of educational spending at Whitney:

The Principal's budget is provided by the TDSB and is designated to run the school, with strong focus on Numeracy & Literacy

The Council budget is designed to enhance the Principal's budget, particularly in Science & Technology and The Arts

Funding comes from parent donations, supplemented by fun community events.

The cost is approximately \$240 per student per year.


