Wednesday Departure from Willowdale MS

- Students going on the trip should arrive at Willowdale
 MS by 7:00AM on Wednesday, May 28th, to board the coach busses.
- Students will go on the bus that is assigned to them (there will be 3 busses).
- Anyone bringing in medication (including Advil, Tylenol, Benadryl, Gravol or prescribed medication) must have it in a Ziplock bag, clearly labelled with their first and last name. Please bring the medication to Ms. Stoikos on Wednesday morning before you board your bus.
- We will be stopping in Kingston for lunch. Students are reminded that they will need to bring their own lunch, or money/debit card to purchase their lunch.

Friday Departure from Montreal

- We will be stopping along the way for lunch. Students are reminded that they will need money/debit card to purchase their lunch.
- Our estimated return time to Willowdale on Friday, May 30th, will be approximately 8:00PM. We will provide a more up to date arrival time upon our departure from Montreal.

Other important information:

• Students are responsible for purchasing their own lunch on each day of the trip. A debit card is suggested. Breakfast and dinner are provided.

- There is only one venue on the itinerary that requires cash only purchases. This is the Bagel shop on our last day.
- All students will receive an envelope with \$30.00 cash. This is the refund for the cost of the trip, as the cost was lowered from its original price.
- We are asking all parents/guardians to ensure that your child has filled out the emergency cell

 with their own cell phone number before Monday.




Bon Voyage!

Jewish Heritage Month

When the Province of Ontario passed the *Jewish Heritage Month Act* in 2012, it recognized the important contributions that Jewish Canadians have made to Ontario's social, economic, political, and cultural fabric.

Since its inception in 2015, the <u>TDSB's Jewish Heritage Committee</u> (JHC) aims to do just that. The Committee aims to celebrate Jewish heritage and culture in impactful, innovative, and inspirational

ways for students - with the fight against antisemitism and all forms of hate providing the core goal of this work.

The JHC is pleased to present two educational programs for May 2025 that have been vetted and approved by TDSB staff.

Being Jewish in Ontario

This brand-new collection for middle and high school educators contains a 10-minute short film and lesson plans with supporting materials in English and French. It explores what it means to be Jewish today through the voices of youth and their family members.

Students learn how Jewish immigrants throughout Ontario built a sense of community, belonging, and opportunity during the early 20th century, despite facing societal exclusion. Through stories of individual and collective action, this history not only educates youth about a specific heritage, but also highlights a universal connection to the generational efforts that foster positive, lasting legacies for vibrant community life and contributions to all Canadians today.

This play is written by Canadian playwright Hannah Moscovitch and produced by the Harold Green Theatre Company and Koffler Arts. It casts local Toronto actors, including high school students, and relays the heartfelt and inspirational tale of <u>Dr. Janusz Korczak's</u> selfless journey to bring safety to Polish-Jewish orphans within the Warsaw Ghetto. His struggle to advocate for children's rights and shelter his orphans from the horrors of the Holocaust ended with his death in 1942. The Children's Republic is a powerful and true story of beauty, heroism, and legacy in a world devoid of freedom and even the necessities of life.

Asian Heritage Month has been proudly recognized by the TDSB every May since 2007. The Province of Ontario celebrates it with the Asian Heritage Act in 2005, and it has been officially designated across Canada since May 2002.

This year's Asian Heritage Month theme, *Asian Canadians Up and Rising*, celebrates the strength, resilience, and achievements of Asian Canadian communities. It recognizes individuals and groups who have contributed to shaping Canada's past and present, while also highlighting emerging voices and future leaders.

For students and staff in the TDSB community, this theme serves as an opportunity to explore stories of perseverance and embrace the unique identities that contribute to both the school community and to

the diverse Asian diaspora in Canada. By learning about and celebrating these diverse perspectives, schools can promote inclusivity, equity, and a deeper appreciation for Asian Canadians.

The TDSB is the largest and one of the most diverse school boards in Canada. Nearly one-quarter of students were born outside of Canada, and collectively, we speak more than 120 languages. According to the 2023 Student Census, 46% of TDSB students self-identified as Asian.
