Peer Mediation

Mr. Long's Guidance Corner

Dear Parents/Guardians of Grade 8 students, we are nearing the end of the high school selection process. In preparation for making a final decision, students need to prepare course plans for all potential schools (this includes a home school and any schools they've applied to). Course planning is done on myBlueprint and students have been provided with a Course Selection Package and instruction to help them with this process. If your child has not yet shared the Course Selection Package with you, please ask them for it.

Immediate Action Required - Students at Winchester are asked to submit ALL course plans by Sunday evening (they've had since Monday to work on them). Submitting course plans simply means they are selecting their courses and submitting them to me on myBlueprint for my review. I check them over for mistakes and follow up with students who have errors in their plans. Given the number of students I support, this requires time so I appreciate your cooperation in submitting your child's course plans this weekend. If you wait and submit them later, I cannot promise your child will be pre-registered to a high school on time.

Once the course plans are correct, they are printed and sent home for a parent signature. Your official high school selection is made by signing and returning ONE course selection plan for the secondary school of your choice. This signed course plan MUST be for a school/program your child has been accepted to and it is due to your child's homeroom teacher by Friday, February 21st (your child has already been accepted to their home schools and if they have applied to TDSB schools, they will hear from them between February 3-14. If you do not hear from a school by February 14th, please contact the high school directly and inquire about the status of your child's application). On the 21st of February, I will collect all submitted course plans, process the forms and pre-register students at their selected schools.

School Buses

If you have made alternative arrangements for picking up your child at the end of the day, please send a ClassDojo message to your child's teacher and notify the Office (phone: 416-393-1270 or email dita.petr@tdsb.on.ca). Verifying arrangements at the end of the day can impact our safe dismissal routine and can cause delays. If a child will not be taking the bus home, and is being pick-up by an adult, please sign them out in the Main Office. Thanks for helping to keep our students safe!

Cancellation of Busses During Severe Weather

Severe weather conditions may require the TDSB to cancel transportation or, in extreme conditions, close schools. The decision to close schools is made by the director of education. In the event transportation is cancelled or schools are closed, the local media will be informed before the beginning of the school day (usually 6:30 a.m.). Tune in to your radio and television news stations for the latest information or visit www.tdsb.on.ca. If buses are cancelled in the morning that will mean that they are cancelled for the day and you will need to make arrangements to get your child to AND from school.

School Bus Zones

Parking Enforcement monitors our school bus loading zones and parking is strictly enforced. Please be mindful not to stop or park in loading zone. The loading zone is located on Rose Avenue beginning at the delivery dock to half-way down the block. If you are picking up your child, please leave your vehicles on Prospect, Ontario or Winchester streets.

Recess During Cold Weather

Elementary school students are kept indoors for recess and lunch times for a number of weather conditions such as rain, lightning in the area, extreme winds and extreme cold. When temperature and wind chill measure -28C or lower, students are kept indoors. Recesses and lunch hour may be shortened if the temperature and wind chill reading is between -20C and -28C.
