#### Sports at Winchester

# **Lunch Program**

Winchester has a staggered lunch to accommodate the number of students.

Primary students (Grade 1 to Gr. 2/3, Rm. 6, 10, 8, 9, 7, 14) have lunch in the lunchroom between 11:40-12:00, while the Junior and Junior/Intermediate students (Grade 3/4 to 8, Rm. 11, 13, 101, 106, 102) enjoy 'lunch recess' outside.

At 12:00 Primary and Junior swap locations and activities. Primary students head outside for 'lunch recess,' while Junior and Intermediate students proceed to the lunchroom. During inclement weather, students will enjoy a movie in the gym instead of being outside.

Our lunchroom is a very busy place. If you would like to see your child at lunch, please sign-in/out in at the Main Office. With parent permission (included in the September package), grade 6, 7 and 8 students may leave the school grounds at lunch. They must remain within the boundaries as outlined in the permission form and return to school no later at 12:20.

No Nuts Please

Please remember that we are a *nut free* school due to severe allergies among some of our students. Please do not send food to school that contains nuts or peanut products.

#### **Scent Aware**

The TDSB is asking for voluntary cooperation towards a scent-reduced environment. We are encouraging staff, students and visitors to avoid or reduce the use of fragranced products. Exposure to perfumes and other scented products can trigger serious health reactions in individuals with asthma, allergies, migraines or chemical sensitivities.

Fragrances are found in a wide range of products, including perfume, cologne, deodorant, soap, fabric softeners and laundry detergents. It is a personal choice to use fragrances, however, fragrance chemicals by their very nature, are shared. The chemicals vaporize into the air and are easily inhaled by those around us. Thank you for your cooperation.

Please remind your child of our expectations regarding behaviour on the bus:

- hands and feet to ourselves;
- quiet, respectful language;
- remain seated at all times;
- no food on the bus

# **Safe Arrival Program**

One measure of keeping students safe is ensuring students have safely arrived at school. If your child is going to be late or absent, it is important that you contact the office. At the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) we now have an automated call-out system that will attempt to contact you if your child is late or absent on the day where the school was not previously informed. The system will call parents/guardians identified in TDSB's Student Information Systems who have access to student records, and emergency contact with priority 1 or 2 will receive a call. When you receive the call, you are required to listen to the entire message and follow the prompts accordingly. We recognize that regular attendance is essential to the safety, academic success, and well-being of all students. Thank you for your continued cooperation to keep your child safe and accounted for. ### **School Bus Loading Zone**

Parking Enforcement monitors our school bus loading zones and parking is strictly enforced. Please be mindful not to stop or park in loading zone. The loading zone is located on Rose Avenue beginning at the delivery dock to half-way down the block. If you are picking up your child, please leave your vehicles on Prospect, Ontario or Winchester streets.

## Anaphylaxis

We feel that all parents would like to be aware that there is a child (or several children) in our school with a severe life-threatening food allergy to nuts and/or latex, called anaphylaxis (ana-fill-axis). These are medical conditions that cause a severe reaction to specific foods or other materials, and can result in death within minutes. Although peanuts and peanut products are the most common foods to cause anaphylaxis, shellfish, fish, eggs, sulphites, milk, sesame seeds, soy or any other food can cause this dangerous condition. In recent years, anaphylaxis has increased dramatically among students. The most common materials to cause allergies are: balloons, Koosh balls, rubber gloves, fabric paints, rubber bands and old Barbie dolls to name just a few items that contain latex and can cause an allergic reaction. Although this may or may not affect your child's class directly, we want to inform you so that you may choose to send foods to school with your child that are free from nuts. The Board has procedures for the prevention and management of anaphylactic reactions. If you are interested, contact the school office for further information. Further information is also available through Anaphylaxis Canada, (416) 785-5666. If your child has health problems of any kind, please inform your child's teacher or office staff immediately so that the necessary health protection steps may be taken. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in ensuring the safest environment.
