

What is Gr. 7 Extended French?

• Grade 7 Extended French programs are intensive French programs developed for students who do not speak French at home. They are designed to provide more experience in the French language than offered in the Core French program, but less than total Immersion. The Extended French program includes French Language and additional subjects taught in the French language.

• Students enrolling in the Gr. 7 Extended French program are expected to have successfully completed the Grade 6 Core French program.

• After Grade 8, students continue the Extended French program at designated secondary schools. Students who successfully complete the secondary program will receive a Certificate of Bilingual Studies in Extended French. Winona students go to **Oakwood C.I.**

Gr. 7 Extended French Program

• Students who are eligible to attend the Grade 7 Extended French program must demonstrate that they have successfully completed the Grade 6 Core French program.

- The program begins in Grade 7 and provides about 40% instruction in French for Grades 7 and 8.
- The subjects taught in French are:
 - French Language (Français)
 - History/Geography
 - One other subject determined by the local school (Winona this is Drama and/or Art)
 - All other subjects are taught in English.

• Students from the Grade 4 Junior Extended French programs and students from the Grade 7 Extended French programs blend at the secondary school level for Grade 9.

• Graduating students who successfully complete the secondary school program (a minimum of 7 credits) are eligible for a Certificate of Bilingual Studies in Extended French from the TDSB.

• Please note: that this application and placement process for the Grade 7 Extended French program is locally managed by the school Principal at each of the 14 school locations.

IMPORTANT Upcoming Changes to Gr. 7 Extended French Programs

- In June 2017, the Board approved a Long Term Program and Accommodation Strategy, establishing Program Priorities aligned with the Vision for Learning and the Integrated Equity Framework, and identifying equity of access to French programs as a key priority for the Board.
- During spring 2018, as part of the Director's Response to the Enhanced Equity Task Force Report, a review was conducted to provide a comprehensive environmental scan of the Board's FSL Programs—Core and intensive French programs.
- This extensive consultation process captured representative feedback from over 10,000 individuals on the TDSB's French programming. Multiple stakeholders were included and also given multiple opportunities to comment on the TDSB's French programs. This process included community meetings, student forums, staff forums, focus groups, as well as on-line surveys.
- In June 2019, the Board of Trustees approved changes to Intensive FSL programs, that is, to restructure the Board's intensive FSL programs leading to a single program model with two entry points and the elimination of all other entry points.

• Timelines have been determined for the entire system. As part of these changes, the Grade 7 Entry Extended French program will phase out entirely. The Grade 7 Extended French program does not currently provide equitable access across TDSB. There are many neighbourhoods with no access to this program that resides in only 14 TDSB schools. Even for students living in the "served catchment" area, there is no guarantee of placement, and there is no capacity to expand the program. Given this information, difficult decisions needed to be made.

• Therefore, the last cohort to enter the Grade 7 Entry Extended French program will begin <u>Grade 7 in September 2022</u>, and will graduate from Grade 8 in June of 2024. There will be no further Grade 7 Entry Extended French programs thereafter. The students who enter in September 2022 will be able to complete the Extended French program through secondary school.

• The streamlining of programs will allow for the increase of access to an intensive FSL program for students in the board. It will permit the focus of resources, both material and human, in order to serve students better, and to strengthen the Core French programming that serves all students in Gr. 4-9 (and beyond) in TDSB schools who do not choose an intensive FSL program. This will also allow a more effective deployment of FSL qualified teachers. The board is committed to improving classroom practice and student engagement in Core French, and thereby improving learning outcomes for students in this program.

Application & Placement Process for 2022-2023

- Interested students and/or parents/guardians must complete an electronic/fillable Application Form for Grade 7 Extended French program and submit it to the designated Grade 7 Extended French school associated to their home address.
- Completed applications are to be submitted electronically to the Gr. 7 Extended French school no later than January 28th, 2022.

- Parents/Guardians will be notified of their child's placement by the receiving school through a letter by the February 18th, 2022.
- Please note: Classes with fewer than 25 students may not open.
- Placement Process as per PR597 section 6.7 (c) When insufficient space is available at a particular school, then students will be admitted to the host school subject to a local school procedure (i.e. lottery). The remaining students will be held on a local school wait-list subject to available space.

Profile of a Student in Extended French

- Successful in Grade 6 core French
- Enthusiastic about learning and oral language communication
- Prepared to speak French both in and out of class
- Completes homework and assignments consistently and able to manage workload
- Ready to seek assistance when required

French Immersion

- In the middle school years (grades 6, 7, 8) the Early French Immersion Program is a half day program with 50% of the day in French and 50% of the day in English. Due to Winona's rotary timetable it is not an even 50/50 split every day.
- The designated school pathways for French Immersion at Winona is from Regal Road and Perth Ave. to Winona to Oakwood Collegiate Institute.
- Middle Immersion students blend with early immersion students to continue studies when they go to high school.

How can parents support students in the French Program?

- Be enthusiastic and positive
- Obtain a membership to the Public Library to access French resource books and novels
- Read French texts regularly
- Encourage students to listen to French radio stations, and watch movies or television in French
- Seek out opportunities to speak French in the community

Special Education Programs

- Students in the Learning Disabilities Program and the Gifted Program will be placed at Winona in the Spring by Central Special Education.
- Families may speak to their school Principal and Special Education Consultant during their child's annual Identification Placement and Review Committee (IPRC)meeting in the Winter about placement if they have questions about next steps.
- Winona hosts a Zoom session in the Spring for incoming Gifted students and their families.
- School visits are scheduled in the Spring for students new to the Learning Disabilities Program.
