Introduction:

The Grade 8 music program seeks to further develop the skills, musical knowledge and participation that the students have already accomplished in Grade 7. Students will continue to learn about various types of music and instruments, music theory, and learn two more periods of music history. Students will be performing solo, and in small groups throughout the term, as well as playing in an end of the term recital.

Course Content

The Course is divided into the following four areas:

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Creation	To further develop the students' instructional abilities, an		
	emphasis will be placed on the technical aspect of playing and ensemble training.		
	More complex note and rhythm reading, ensemble playing		
	and performance.		
Understanding	More complicated time values, more complex rhythms, t		
	playing and notation of dynamic notation, the introduction		
	of Italian musical terms, signs and abbreviations, and the		
	development of harmony.		
Communication	Students will become more acquainted with the various		
	historical periods and continue to gain an understanding of:		
	1) Difference between orchestra, band and choral		
	groupings.		
	2) 2 more periods of music – Baroque and Classical.		
Application	Students will further develop in the areas of melody,		
	identification of more complex rhythms, harmony, and		
	texture.		

Materials:

The following is a list of materials needed for each class:

<u>Classroom Expectations</u>:

- 1. Arrive on time.
- 2. Come to class prepared with music practiced.
- 3. Know and abide by the Code of Behaviour (see Student Agenda).
- 4. If you are having difficulty with playing your instrument, seek extra help.
- 5. If you are absent, it is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to catch up. If you are absent on the day of a written or playing test, it is your responsibility to arrange a time with the teacher to write or play the test on another date. This should be done immediately upon your return to school.
- 6. If you play a reeded instrument you must bring your reed to each class. If you forget or damage your reed a new one must be purchased for \$2.

Assessment and Evaluation:

This includes frequent short tests on your instrument, student assignments and written tests from theory workbook, music history tests and assignments, and participation.

★Level 3 is defined as the **provincial standard**. A student achieving at level 3 should be well prepared for work in the next grade level or the next course.

Please note that this is a HALF YEAR course. Students taking this course in the first half of the year (September – January) will receive a Music mark on their report card for Term 1. Students taking this course in the second half of the year (February – June) will receive a Music mark on their report card for Term 2.

Practising

To ensure success, each student needs to be practising their instrument for at least an hour every week. Each time students practice, they should record it on their practice log. If students are unable to bring their instrument home to play, they should practice in the music room before and/or after school. Students should check the music room door to see when the music room is available for students to practise.
