

School Bus Responsibilities

The success of our transportation program depends on the cooperation of students, parents, school staff and the companies we work with. We all take part in ensuring the safety of our students.

Students' responsibilities:

- Be well behaved on the bus by not fighting, shouting or rough-housing on the bus
- Follow the driver's instructions
- Be on time for pick-up and go directly to the bus lines at the end of the day

Parents' responsibilities:


- 🚊 Ensure your child is at the designated bus stop on time
- Maintain open communication with the driver about your child (i.e. behavioural or medical concerns)
- Inform the bus company if someone else is picking up your child or if your child will not be on the bus
- Contact the school if you have any concerns about transportation

Drivers' responsibilities:

- Transport students safely to and from their school from their designated stop
- Notify parents of any changes in pick-up or drop-off times
- Ensure students are met by their parent or caregiver, (purple tag program)
- f a parent or caregiver is not there to meet a child, the driver has the following options:
 - Drop off the remaining students and return to the child's drop-off location
 - Deliver the student to the emergency contact person if available and nearby
 - Return the student to the school (if there are any staff members in the building)

The Bus Loop & Parking Lot



- Parents/Guardians MAY use the BUS LOOP prior to 9:00 am follow the direction of the staff on duty.
- Please DO NOT park on Yorkview Drive at or near the entrance to the bus loop. It is a NO STOPPING ZONE.
- The busses require the entire width of the street to make the turn safely into the Bus Loop.
- Parking on Yorkview Drive near the Bus Loop creates hazards for the Bus Drivers, other drivers and most importantly, the **YORKVIEW STUDENTS**.
- The Parking Lot is for Yorkview Staff only between 8.30 am 4.00 pm. Please do not park in the lot during these hours, <u>this includes Yorkview</u> <u>Kids Care families</u> no exceptions.

Code of Conduct and Positive School Climate

Walk & Roll to School Day: OCT 5th

Active transportation to school -walking or cycling to get to and from school- has long been known to be an important source of physical activity for children. However, many parents drive their children to school because they think that it is safe and convenient. Car traffic is linked to more traffic collisions, more greenhouse gas emissions and an overall decrease in children's levels of physical activity. Let's try and clear the roads in front of Yorkview by walking or rolling to school on October 5, Yorkview!

Did you know?

- If children walked for all trips of less than one kilometer, they would take an average of 2,238 additional steps per day. WOW!
- Just 1/3 of Canadian children and youth walk or cycle to school
- Children and youth are more at risk for the health effects of poor air quality due to car emissions than adults


