and the need for extra care in even the most ordinary and everyday routines, no matter where you are.


Morning Drop-Off and After-School Pick-Up Reminders

- Morning supervision begins at 8:38 AM, teachers are on duty during this time and students should not be dropped off at school earlier than 8:38 AM
- Please do not idle in the drop-off/pick-up area; starting next week staff on duty will kindly ask parents idling in the morning to proceed to the exit lane to reduce morning congestion outside the school
- The community parking lot can also be used across the field for morning drop-off
- Afterschool Pick-Up Reminders Morning Drop Off and After School Pick Up Reminders
 - Teachers are on duty after school from 3:05 PM 3:20 PM; an outbound phone in the office can be used by students to call parents when needed
 - Please do not idle in the drop-off/pick-up area; starting next week staff on duty will kindly ask parents to park in a parking spot or proceed to the exit lane to reduce congestion outside the school
 - The community parking lot can also be used across the field when our school parking lot is full during after school pick up









Professional Activity Day

The following information outlines the expectations for school-based staff on the upcoming **Professional Activity Day – January 19, 2024 (Elementary).**

<u>Policy/Program Memorandum (PPM) 151</u>, *Professional Activity Days Devoted to Provincial Education Priorities*, mandates Boards to identify three PA Days focused on provincial education priorities. The provincial education priorities for the 2023-2024 school year are as follows:

- Literacy and Mathematics
- Curriculum Implementation
- Student Well-being, School Safety and Violence Prevention

As per <u>PPM 151</u>, the professional learning activities for PA Days shall consider factors such as equity and human rights in education, anti-racism and anti-discrimination, Indigenous Education, and equitable learning opportunities for students with disabilities and special education needs.

High Performing Athlete Programs - Central Application Process

The High Performing Athlete Programs provide academic programming and flexible scheduling for student-athletes who are involved in provincial, national or international level training and competition.

In order to meet the demands of intense training schedules, these programs provide more flexible timetables to balance school with out-of-school commitments, so that athletes can strive for both academic and athletic excellence.

Historically, applications have been done through the former Optional Attendance process and, last year, as a Central Student Interest Program. To better align with the timing at which athletes are identified for these high levels of competition, the process is now run through a separate application, which opened in the first week of January. The application will remain open until January 31, 2024. Should spaces remain available after that time, the application will be re-opened later in the Spring for student-athletes who qualify at a later date. Moving forward, the application is intended to remain open for continuous intake, where space is available, to meet the needs of newly eligible student-athletes.

Online Interpreter Training Program

The Parent/Caregiver Engagement Office is excited to offer the Online Interpreter Training program again. We will be offering the opportunity to 85 TDSB parents/caregivers to receive online interpreter training in TDSB's most requested languages! Administrators are asked to share this opportunity with their school communities.

Are you a parent/caregiver with a child registered in the TDSB who:

- 1. has full proficiency in English and another language (i.e., Pashto, Farsi, Roma, Ukrainian);
- 2. is interested in being trained as an interpreter to work with the TDSB;
- 3. is comfortable with virtual/online learning;
- 4. has access to a computer, and the internet and has, at minimum, intermediate computer fluency;
- 5. has a recording device, headphones, and dictionaries (hard copy and/or online).

TDSB is the largest school board in Canada and one of the most diverse. 23% of our students were born outside of Canada and there are over 120 languages spoken by TDSB students and their parents/caregivers. Research also identifies communication between the home and the school as essential to student success. Ensuring equitable engagement opportunities for our multi-lingual parents/caregivers, while maximizing their language assets, will enable the TDSB to improve communication between parents/caregivers and the school/Board.
