School Drop Off & Pick Up Safety Reminders

At *Zion Heights Middle School*, we are fortunate to have several safety initiatives, programs, and policies that contribute to a safe and caring school. Even though most incidents happen away from school, we want to emphasize to all students, staff and parents the importance of awareness and the need for extra care in even the most ordinary and everyday routines, no matter where you are.

- Morning Drop-Off and After-School Pick-Up Reminders
 - Morning supervision begins at 8:38 AM, teachers are on duty during this time and students should not be dropped off at school earlier than 8:38 AM
 - Please do not idle in the drop-off/pick-up area; starting next week staff on duty will kindly ask parents idling in the morning to proceed to the exit lane to reduce morning congestion outside the school
 - The community parking lot can also be used across the field for morning drop-off
- Afterschool Pick-Up Reminders Morning Drop Off and After School Pick Up Reminders
 - Teachers are on duty after school from 3:05 PM 3:20 PM; an outbound phone in the office can be used by students to call parents when needed

- Please do not idle in the drop-off/pick-up area; starting next week staff on duty will kindly ask parents to park in a parking spot or proceed to the exit lane to reduce congestion outside the school
- The community parking lot can also be used across the field when our school parking lot is full during after school pick up

Procedure 705 - Selection, Promotion, and Placement Process for Vice-principals allows for parent/caregivers/guardian representatives identified through the Parent Involvement Advisory Committee (PIAC) to participate in Vice-Principal interviews.

If you would like to volunteer to participate in the Spring 2024 Vice-Principal interviews you are required to do the following:

- Complete the Expression of Interest (link Interview Survey) no later than January 31, 2024
- 2. Be available for the virtual VP Process and Interview Training Session scheduled for Monday, February 5, 2024 (Virtual) 6:00 pm 8:00 pm

Please note attendance at a training session is mandatory to participate as a Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Representative on a Vice-Principal Interview Team.

- 3. Be available for the Spring 2024 cycle. Interviews for the Elementary Vice-Principal and Secondary Vice-Principal will be held on the following interview dates:
- Tuesday, February 20, 2024
- Thursday, February 22, 2024
- You will not be scheduled for more than one of these dates.
- Depending on the number of interview teams scheduled, not all parent representatives may be scheduled.
- You will be informed by e-mail no later than the week before the scheduled date if you have been placed on an interview team or identified as an alternate/backup for the day.
- The interview day begins with a team caucus at 8:00 am with the site coordinators. The last interview of the day will commence no later than 3:30 pm.

During the month of February, African Heritage (Black) History Month is recognized across Canada thanks to The Honourable MP Jean Augustine, who introduced the motion in the House of Commons in December 1995; it officially took effect in February in 1996. The Black History Month Act was also passed in Ontario in 2016 and has been formally recognized since.

African Heritage (Black History) Month is an occasion to commemorate present and past individuals who helped shape the path of our future student leaders, while also celebrating the many achievements and contributions of numerous individuals with this heritage! Their voices and actions impact our society, and work to continuously improve the world we live in.

Through meticulous instruction from Orientation & Mobility Specialists, these students become more confident and independent every day. White Cane Week not only shows how important the white cane is as a symbol, but also highlights how it makes a big difference in the daily lives of those who depend on it for navigation.
